

## **Out of Home Care Program**

The Out of Home Care program provides support for students who are in **statutory out of home care** (OOHC) by definition of the Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998 No 157 Sections 135 and 135A.

**Statutory out of home care** is out of home care that is provided in respect of a child or young person for a period of more than 14 days:

- pursuant to a care order of the Children's Court, or
- by virtue of the child or young person being a protected person

It does not include any care provided by a relative of a child or young person unless:

- the Minister has parental responsibility for the child or young person by virtue of an order of the Children's Court, or
- the child or young person is in the care of the Director-General

## The Support Teacher (OOHC) can support your school in the following ways:

- determine student's eligibility for the OOHC program (Statutory OOHC)
- assist in gathering relevant background information
- assist the School Learning Support Team in the development and review of the Education
  Plan and cover sheet
- support school staff (including SLSOs) in understanding the educational implications for students in OOHC and developing appropriate strategies
- provide professional learning for staff as requested
- liaise with other DEC personnel. This may include Learning and Engagement staff, Aboriginal education and curriculum
- support the school to develop a risk assessment / behaviour management plan if required
- liaise with outside agencies. This may include Family and Community Services (FACS), Non Government Organisations (NGOs) and Ageing, Disability and Home Care (ADHC)
- attend planning meetings as required
- advise of additional DEC support services e.g. AP (Learning and Support)
- maintain and utilise the OOHC database to assist in the strategic and timely support of students in OOHC
- support the development of an application for funding from the OOHC program if required
